
IWA President Susan Chisholm's message and Diary Dates

Hilary received her Honoured Active award from District A70 patron South Australian Governor Her Excellency, the Honourable Frances Adamson AC at a Celebratory lunch at the Kensington Hotel.

Since joining Inner Wheel in 1985, Hilary has held many positions at both club and District level. In 2003 she became IWA Vice-President and went on to IWA President in 2004/5. Now,



38 years on, she continues to hold positions at club and District level. In 1994, her role of District A70 Social Convenor is credited which much of the District's success.

She was one of the A70 conference co-ordinators in 2000 and was IWA Conference Registrar in 2014, and was a board director of International Inner Wheel in 2007-2008.



Our guest speaker today was Mat Bowtell, Founder and CEO of Free 3D Hands, an Australian charity who designs and 3D prints hands and assistive devices. The hands are provided for free, to children and adults around the world. Mat freely shares his designs under an open source licence so others can make and repair their own devices and to encourage further innovation.

They are currently developing a low-cost, multi-grip bionic arm and their goal is to make the equivalent of a \$60,000 bionic arm for less than \$60 in parts.









Entertainment was provided by local vocal group 'Sisters and Misters' (today it was just the Sisters). The large group of more than 30 ladies were led by its founder and director Irene Bennetts. We all joined in as they sang a variety of familiar songs including My Girl, Sweet Caroline, Twist & Shout and Do You Love Me? There was even the opportunity to get dancing...and all this before lunch!









After lunch IWA Executive committee: Susan, Melissa, Julie, Lyn and Jenni ran a Q&A style forum, where each offered advice on *"Getting our ducks in a row"*.

Some of the key points were:

- The importance of using and passing on to incoming position holders the generic email accounts (gmail). Only gmail addresses will be included in the directory from 2024/25
- Sending an email to IWA Treasurer after depositing or transferring money to IWA
- All members have access to the members area of IWA website using the login details sent to your District secretary.


















































































Guest speaker this morning was Helen Comport who spoke about the quilts she makes for injured servicemen and women.




International Inner Wheel news
